# Introduction

Covenant University is a vision-birther, vision driven University established in the footsteps of world-renowned institutions like Yale, Princeton, Duke and Harvard. The founding philosophy and pillars of Covenant University are deeply rooted in biblical principles and are directed towards effecting a change that will advance humanity and restore dignity to Africa.

Our mandate is to develop the total man. The undergraduate academic programme of the University is focused on raising a new generation of leaders equipped to positively influence their world. We believe that leadership is the greatest need of Africa today and that a solid base of good character and life-applicable learning skills are crucial to building the needed leadership needs of Africa.

Therefore, our central mission at Covenant University is to raise a new set of leaders through well packaged strategies which compel the institution to admit young, single, disciplined and vision-driven students, who are ready and determined to accept full responsibility for the revolution that the university seeks to birth in Africa.

Covenant University, rated by the National Universities Commission, as the best private University in Nigeria runs a collegiate System. These colleges are: College of Science and Technology, College of Human Development and College of Business and Social Sciences and there are forty-degree programmes in its three colleges.

## Studying at Covenant University:

The facilities in the Covenant University Main Campus include:

**a. College of Business and Social Sciences: -**

This is a three-story ultra modern structure conceptualized from the marriage of two U-shaped forms. It has a total floor space area of 12, 748 m<sup>2</sup>. It equally provides space for College of Human Development. These buildings for now still serve as the administrative hub of the University.

**b. College of Science and Technology: -**

This college building has a floor area of 11,980 m<sup>2</sup>. It is a three story complex comprising of 25 lecture rooms, 17 specialized Science/

Engineering laboratories and 45 Single/Executive offices. Other spaces include 4 conference rooms, utility spaces and general conveniences.

### c. Halls of Residence

There are 10 halls of residence comprising 5 male halls and 5 female halls. The student hostel facility can effectively accommodate 9150 students. In each of the 10 halls of residence, there are ancillary spaces such as common room, butteries, tuck shops, telephone rooms, barbing/beauty saloons, porters' room and administrative offices.

### d. Staff Quarters

Covenant quarters is a composite structure in four floor levels, grouped into three complexes. Each complex has 32no. Two-bedroom flats and 8 no. One-bedroom flats. The total capacity of the

### e. Cafeteria

The cafeteria is situated amidst the 10 halls of residence. It has a capacity for 2000 students dining at the same time. It is an expansive free space structure roofed with a parabolic lattice steel frame covered with aluminum sheets of that shape, to suit its curvature. The cafeteria operates a "pay as you eat" system. Cafeteria services are available between 8.00 am and 10.00pm. The University's control over the cafeteria is only in prescribing a policy framework and providing an environment for Hygienic services, non-

profiteering practices and equitable trading norms by approved operators.

Foreign students are advised to arrange for pre-paid services with the cafeteria management for their catering need for the semester.

#### f. Covenant University Chapel

The Covenant University Chapel is an ultra-modern architectural Masterpiece, situated in the heart of the University campus. It has a seating capacity of 4,500. In addition to the Chapel being used as a centre for the student's spiritual development; it also serves as a lecture venue for University courses. The University Chaplaincy and the Student Council offices are resident in the complex.

#### g. Covenant University Library

This is one of the newly completed 2-story edifices in the University campus otherwise known as

Centre for Learning Resources; it has a total area of 11,232 m<sup>2</sup>.

It is strategically located amidst the College buildings, University Chapel and the Halls of Residence. It will be able to accommodate up to 2,500 readers and about 500 researching staff and postgraduate students.

#### h. Sports Complex

The Sports Complex is located at the left side of the main entrance to the University. The facilities currently under construction are; the football pitch, hockey pitches, lawn tennis

courts, volleyball pitches, badminton courts, basketball courts and a standard size swimming pool.

**i. Medical Services:**

The University looks forward to students being healthy by virtue of their covenant right. However, comprehensive medical service is available for students who may need them. Student's health bills are not recharged because they are not desired and therefore predetermined. We therefore expect students to pay as they have occasion to visit the center.

**j. Books and Bookshop:**

Students will be in a position to buy recommended texts from the university bookshop. The budget that students should make on books would vary from one student to the other depending on the course, the level, preferences and habits.

**k. Infrastructures:**

These include the campus water works, comprising a large overhead tank, several underground reservoirs, treatment plant and 3.0 KVA, which supplements the public power supply, central sewage treatment plant and well asphalt tarred roads and drainage.

All these are put in place to make campus life conducive for learning.

**Undergraduate Admission Requirement**

Following our central mission to raise a new generation of leaders, Covenant University conducts a two-phase screening exercise for intending students. The first screening is essentially an evaluation

process called Covenant University Scholastic Aptitude Test (CUSAT). The second screening exercise follows after the first but places emphasis on the candidate's character as well as their social, medical and economic background. This second screening is essentially an exercise in eligibility enquiry designed to ascertain mental, medical and spiritual readiness of applicants for the Covenant University experience.

### **International Student Admission Requirements**

An international student in Covenant University is defined as any intending student applying to the university for admission consideration who is not a citizen of Nigeria. To be eligible for consideration applicants must fulfill the following requirements:

1. Complete and send an admission application form.
2. Submit statements of result/certificates of secondary school education.
3. Attach a letter of reference from your pastor/imam/priest
4. Write the Covenant University Scholastic Aptitude Test (CUSAT).

**ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

**COLLEGE OF SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY**

Credit level passes in 5 subjects in the SSCE/NECO or their foreign equivalent obtained at not more than two sittings prior to September 2006 must include Mathematics, Physics and English Language. However, candidates seeking admission into degree programmes in Biochemistry, Biology and Microbiology must have obtained credit passes in Chemistry

and Biology. But for candidates seeking admission into degree programmes in Estate Management credit level pass in Physics is not compulsory.

In addition to the above requirements, candidates must also meet the following departmental requirements.

**a) Computer Science**

Credit level passes in Chemistry and either Biology or Agric. Science.

**b) Management Information System**

Credit level passes in Economics and any science subject

**c) Architecture**

Credit level passes in any of the following subjects: Fine Art/ Technical Drawing/ Geography and any other Science subject or Commercial subject.

**d) Estate Management**

Credit level passes in Economics plus two other subjects one of which must be a science subject selected from Physics, Biology, Chemistry and Technical Drawing

**e) All Programmes in the School of Engineering**

Credit level passes in Chemistry and any one of Further Mathematics, Technical Drawing, or Biology.

**f) Building Technology**

Credit level passes in Chemistry and Technical Drawing or any other Science subject.

**g) Industrial Mathematics**

Credit level passes in Mathematics and any other two Science subjects or one Science subject and one Social Science subject.

**h) Industrial Chemistry**

Credit level passes in Chemistry and any other one Science subject.

**i) Industrial Physics.**

Credit level passes in Physics and any other two Science subjects.

## **COLLEGE OF BUSINESS & SOCIAL SCIENCES**

A minimum of Five (5) credit level passes including English Language, Mathematics, Economics and any one Science subject selected from this group (Biology, Health Science, Agricultural Science, Chemistry and Physics) obtained in not more than two sittings in the SSCE/NECO/GCE O/L or other equivalent prior to September 2006. Literature-in-English cannot be substituted for English Language but Further Mathematics may be substituted for General Mathematics.

In addition to the above requirements, candidates must also meet the following departmental requirements:

### **A. Department of Accounting**

Candidates must have a minimum of Credit level pass in English Language, Mathematics, Economics and one Science subject selected from the above-specified group.

### **B. Banking & Finance**

Same as A above.

### **C. Department of Business Studies**

Candidates must have a minimum of credit level pass in five (5) subjects including Mathematics, English Language, Economics and one Science subject selected from the above specified group.

### **D. Department of Economics & Development Studies**

Same as in (C) above.

### **E. Department of Policy and Strategic Studies**

Candidates must have a minimum of credit level pass in Mathematics, English Language, Economics, Government or History and one Science subject selected from the above group.

## **COLLEGE OF HUMAN DEVELOPMENT**

Candidates seeking admission into any of the College's programmes must have obtained at least five (5) credit level passes in SSCE/NECO or their foreign equivalent in not more than two sittings prior to September 2006. The five (5) credit passes must include Mathematics, English Language and one science subject selected from this group (Biology, Health Science, Agricultural Science, Chemistry and Physics).

In addition to the general requirements, candidates must also meet the following departmental requirements:

**A. Department of English and Literary Studies.**

- i. Credit level pass in Literature-in-English for B.A. English, B.A. Literature-in-English.
- ii. For the B.A. French programme credit level pass in French SSCE, NECO O/L; or C.E.F.P./DELF (Certificates awarded by Alliance Française; or Pre-Degree certificate in French from any recognized University). In addition, candidates must obtain Credit level pass in Literature. However, in special circumstances candidates without the qualifications stated above for French may be considered provided they are willing to undergo a selection exercise and a special foundation programme.

**B. Department of Human Resource Development**

- i. Credit level pass in Biology for B.Sc. Psychology.

**C. Department of Mass Communication**

- i Credit level pass in Literature in English for B.Sc. Mass Communication and B.Sc. Public Relations.

**D. Department of Sociology.**

- i. Credit level pass in History or Government for B.Sc. Sociology

Covenant University conducts screening exercise for all candidates seeking admission into the University and applicants may not be admitted without fulfilling the demands of the screening exercise.

**School Fees:**

Covenant University charges very concessionary school fees which are determined by the course being enrolled for by students. Foreign students are required to make down payments for sundry expenses such as; feeding, medical and personal/book allowances in addition to the school fees per session. This is to prevent, disruption in the student's academic programme and undue extra travel expenses due to financial constraint. Overleaf is the fee structure for foreign students
